**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WASHINGTON,
COUNTY OF MORRIS, AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY MAKING
SUBTITLE ONE OF TITLE 39 WITH VARIOUS TRAFFIC
REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO CHANCELLOR WAY AND
ESTABLISHING AND REGULATING MID-BLOCK CROSSWALKS**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Washington, in the County of Morris, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Toll N.J. IV, L.P. has filed a written consent with the Township of Washington that the provisions of Subtitle One of Title 39 of the revised statutes of New Jersey for Various Traffic Regulations be made applicable to mid-block crosswalks on the semi-public road known as Chancellor Way located in the Estates at Long Valley subdivision in the Township of Washington, County of Morris; and the following regulations shall be enforceable based on the subdivision plans entitled "Final Plat, Estates at Long Valley (Section 3), Lots 8, 21 & 21.04, Block 18 and Lot 1, Block 18.01, Township of Washington, Morris County, New Jersey", prepared by Ferriero Engineering, Inc., Chester, New Jersey, dated July 11, 2006 and consisting of three sheets:

Mid-block crosswalks:

The following locations shall be established as Mid-Block Crosswalks:

LOCATION

Chancellor Way

(A) Beginning at a point 420 feet South of the southerly curblineline of Bartley Road (CR#625) and extending to a point 10 feet southerly therefrom.

(B) Beginning at a point 4110 feet South of the southerly curblineline of Bartley Road (CR#625) and extending to a point 10 feet southerly therefrom.

SECTION 2. Appropriate signs shall be erected and maintained and the crosswalk area shall be painted as required by the NJ Department of Transportation.

SECTION 3. All ordinances of the Township of Washington that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon publication and as required by law and upon the posting of appropriate signs and upon approval of the Commissioner of Transportation.
